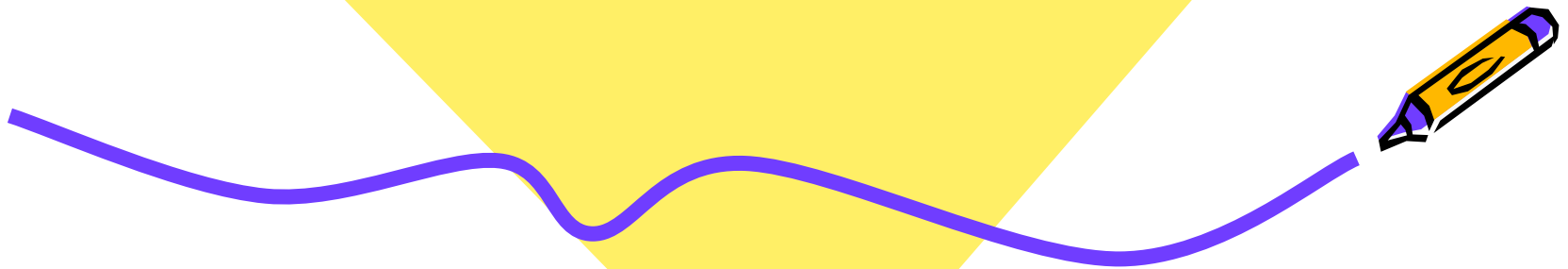


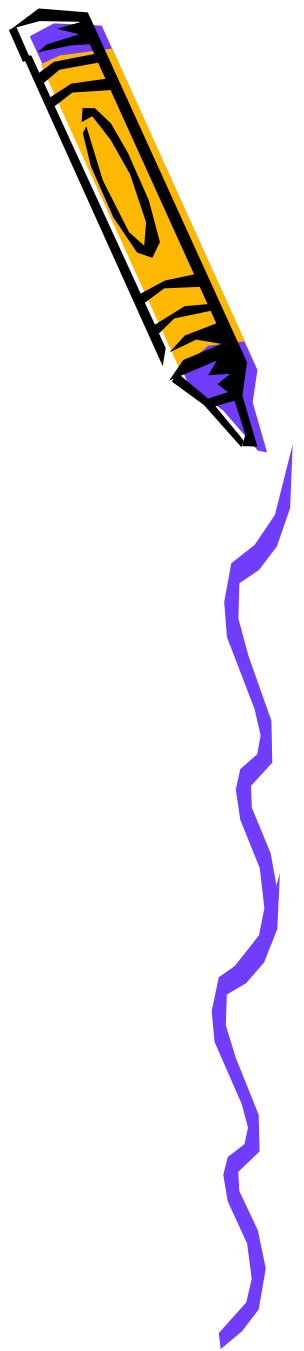

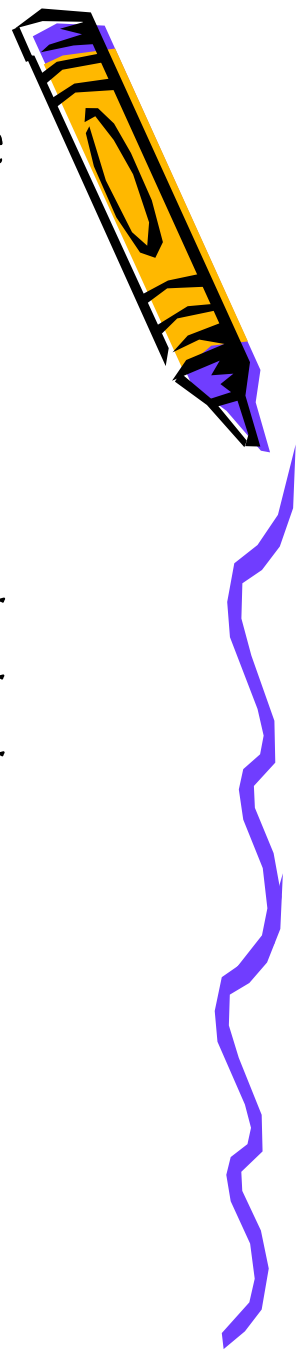

In the summer term of 2019, children in Year 6 will be sitting SATs papers in:

- ◊ Reading
- ◊ Maths
- ◊ Spelling, punctuation and grammar

These tests will be both set and marked externally. Your child's marks will be used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broader picture of their attainment.



May 13th – 16th 2019



- ◊ It is important that all children are in school for EVERY test.
- ◊ Children are not awarded a test mark/grade if they are not in school.
- ◊ The tests **MUST** be taken on the set day and cannot be taken before or after the set date for any reason.



Monday 13th May

English grammar, punctuation and spelling test, Paper 1, short answer questions
Paper 2, spellings

Tuesday 14th May

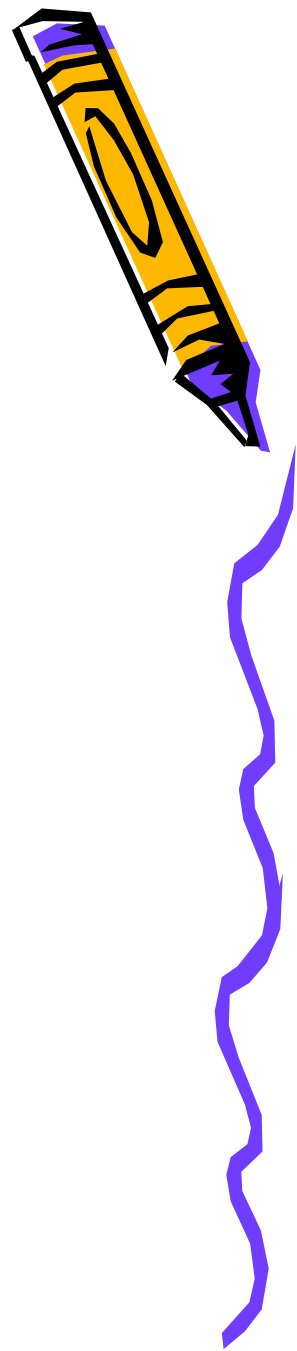
English reading test, reading booklet and associated answer booklet.

Wednesday 15th May

Mathematics, Paper 1, arithmetic test.
Mathematics, Paper 2, reasoning.

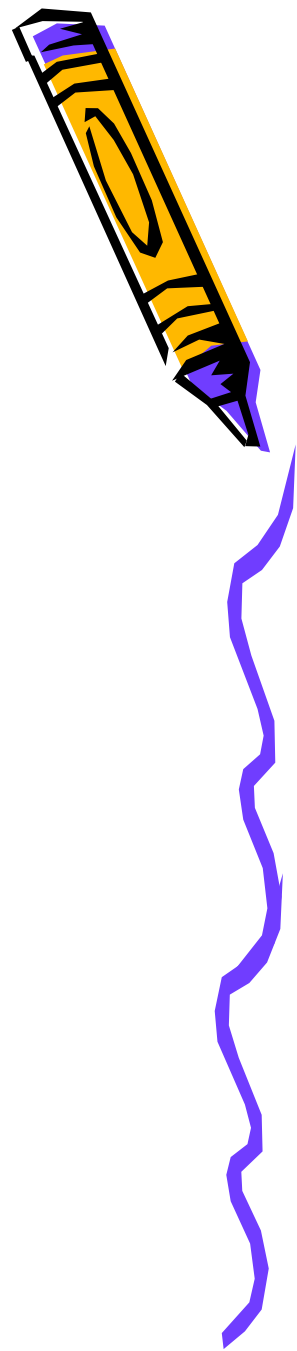
Thursday 16th May

Mathematics Paper 3, reasoning.



Mathematics Tests

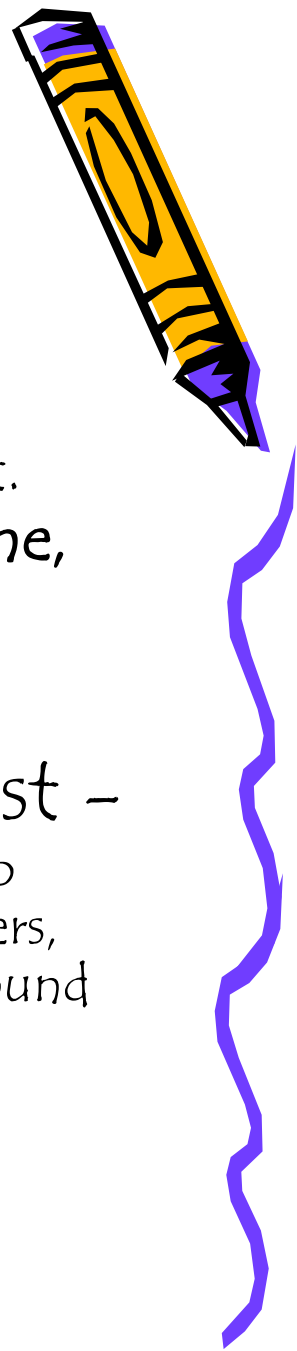
- ◇ Children will sit three papers in maths:
- ◇ Paper 1: arithmetic, 30 minutes
- ◇ Papers 2 and 3: reasoning, 40 minutes per paper



English Tests

Comprise of:

- ◇ Reading Test – The reading test will be a single paper with questions based on three passages of text. Your child will have one hour, including reading time, to complete the test.
- ◇ Grammar, spelling and punctuation Test – The grammar, punctuation and spelling test will consist of two parts: a grammar and punctuation paper requiring short answers, lasting 45 minutes, and a spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 15 minutes.

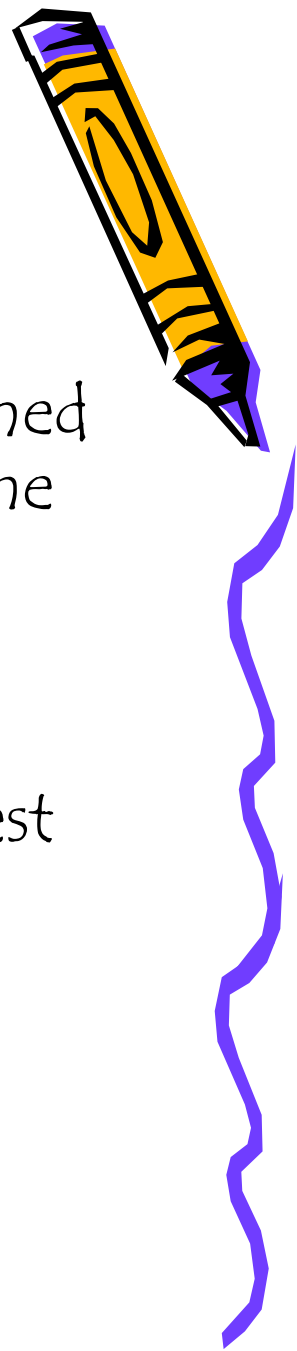


Writing

- ◇ How is it assessed?
- ◇ Working above what is expected
- ◇ Working at expected standard
- ◇ Working towards the expected standard



What are 'Teacher Assessments'?



- ◇ These are ongoing assessments which are informed by the teacher's knowledge and assessment of the children on a day to day basis
- ◇ They offer a fairer indication of the child's 'real' ability
- ◇ There can sometimes be a difference between test results and teacher assessments
- ◇ What is sent to secondary school?



Assessment Procedure



- ◇ The test papers are sent to external markers in the UK
- ◇ They arrive back in school early in July
- ◇ They will be reviewed and collated by staff here and published in their school report.



What information do parents receive and when?



- ◇ You will be sent your child's results (in the format below) teacher assessments and additional information showing overall performance in percentages of the school alongside their school report.
- ◇ Reading, SPAG and Maths – Raw score for test will be converted into a scaled score. The score of 100 is the expected scaled score for a Year 6 pupil. The scaled score will range from 80 to 120. 110 or above is 'Working at greater depth.'



What can parents do to help?



- ◇ We do not want your children to feel under pressure. They need to be familiar with the tests and booster groups have started. Children will take tests in their classroom with their 'group' teacher.
- ◇ Revision websites – BBC Revisewise, Doodlemaths, Hit the Button. Children will be sent home over Easter with practice sats questions.

- ◇ Offer LOTS of reassurance
